Our wonderful 5,356-yard heathland-links course plays through stunning pines, heather and dunes offering a truly unique experience. With a huge variety of holes Formby Ladies creates an incredibly enjoyable round of golf.

The tight fairways and strategic bunkering protect the course, so don't be fooled by its yardage.

In 2024, we won the Ecological Project of the Year award for restoring our SSSI compartment to favourable condition and our commitment to sustainability.

At the start of 2025, we also climbed to 92nd in England in the National Club Golfer rankings.

HISTORY

Women originally played at Formby Golf Club and had their own committee in 1886. The ladies' section at FGC thrived for the next 10 years. Indeed, the first plus handicap recorded at FGC was that of a woman, Miss M. I. Bushby, who returned a gross score of 72 on 18th November 1885.

Relations between the two sections were excellent. However, when the men decided to make alterations to their course in 1896, the women asked if they could have a course of their own.

On New Year's Day 1896, the Formby Ladies Golf Club (FLGC) was born as a nine-hole course, which was extended to 18 holes on 1st July 1908.

Over the years, we have hosted many prestigious competitions at county, national, and international levels, including the British Girls' Home Internationals, the British Men's Seniors, the British Women's Seniors, and most recently, the Rose Ladies Series.



COURSE ETIQUETTE

To ensure a pleasant round for all visitors and members, we kindly ask that you adhere to the following requests on the day of your visit:

- Play from the red tee of the day.
- Repair your pitch marks, replace your divots, and leave rakes in the bunker after raking.
- Be aware that greenkeeping staff working on the course have priority at all times.
- Do not take a fairway shot to the 1st green until the 2nd tee has cleared.
- Soft spikes only, please.

Formby Ladies Golf Club reserves the right to ask anyone seen ignoring these requests, particularly those relating to course safety, to leave the golf course.

Please be aware that our golf course may be subject to necessary maintenance procedures later in the season.

While we strive to minimise disruptions, some maintenance activities may temporarily impact the condition of certain areas of the course.
